

ICAS assessments, conducted by the UNSW, assess student's ability to apply classroom learning in new contexts, using higher-order thinking and problem-solving skills. Students' efforts are recognised and rewarded through certificates and medal ceremonies for top performers, motivating students to attain greater academic success.

<u>ICAS tests are optional</u>. This year, the parent registration, payment and completion of these ICAS assessments are all done online.


- Check the balance of their Youth Saver account
