### Stage 3 Camp Recount by Tom S

As my dad and I drove down Hardy's Bay I quadruple checked that I had everything I needed for a three-day camp in Bathurst. I had three sets of clothes since the wet weather before had almost definitely made the dirt turn into mud. All of year five and six were going to be there, on a bus for a four-hour bus trip. We left at fifteen minutes shy of eight o'clock on a luxury bus. I sat at the back with my other year six friends. I had a window seat, so as we drove out of the Central Coast and inland I got a firsthand view of the landscape.
