determined to be elected as one of our 2 sport captain positions.






Stg2 Bouddi National Park Excursion

In our geography lessons, Years 3 and 4 have been learning about ways to protect our local environment. On Monday we were lucky enough to go on a field trip to Bouddi National Park.

When we arrived, we met our tour guides from Rumbalara Educational Centre. Students studied the footprints of a variety of animals and their scats (droppings). We then studied the map of Bouddi National Park, looked at the key features of a map and also practised using a compass for navigation.

After recess, we went on the coastal walk to Gerrin Point Lookout. Along the way we learned about native plants and how Aboriginal people use them for a variety of purposes. We observed the natural features of the environment and used watercolour pencils to draw our beautiful surroundings.

The highlight for many students on this trip were the animal sightings. We saw the expected birds and bugs, but there were other creatures that we were not expecting. A massive 2m python crossed our walking path and we carefully watched it slither away. Then, there were seals! We saw three Australian fur seals swimming in the ocean - it was unreal!
